Secretary's Report for 2016 GAOC AGM

A few things have developed during the year.

- 1. Our USOF membership for 2015 is 128 persons, 104 memberships and 41 votes. We are eligible for 2 delegates & 2 alternates at the USOF AGM, September 17, 2015 in Pound Ridge, New York.
- 2. Our GAOC membership list is 332. Our AGM vote list is 124 votes. We have; 40 individual (1vote), 5 group (2 votes), --- family (2 votes), 13 couple (2 votes) memberships. The memberships with 2 votes must have 2 individuals present to get the 2 votes. There is no proxy voting. Our quorum for voting is 2 x Number of officers (5) + 1 = 11.
- 3. Our GAOC waiver list is 1,250. We are keeping an annual waiver list now because our insurance assumes everyone who participates is a member. The insurance allows us to count those who sign waivers as members for insurance purposes. I want to upgrade registration forms to indicate annual waiver status because the separate annual waiver forms create massive paperwork to keep track of.
- 4. Our relations with landowners are very good.

Our largest group is the Georgia Department of Natural Resources. The parks people has modernized their permit and concession process. I now get to electronically sign contracts, which cuts out mailing contracts back and forth. The wildlife people still use the paper and mail method, but we only deal with them for Joe Kurz.

Our relations with the other landowners are good. Each has their own particular requirements, but as long as we comply, we get to use their property and that is good.

- 5. The permanent course activity has been good, especially at Red Top. They go through more than 200 packages a year. The second most successful is Sweetwater and they go through about 150. Our other location, Panola Mountain is in the process of ordering more packages. They will get the updated maps.
- 6. Our status as a Georgia Non Profit Corporation is current.
- 7. Our status as an IRS 501c3 charitable organization is current. Tax returns are filed every year.
- 8. Meet directors have been doing a fair job of keeping me informed of their plans. Meet directors need to contact the park to be sure they can do what they want and then contact me so I can make the paperwork happen. If date changes/additions are needed, coordinate with the president and let me know. Contracts and insurance certificates must be written for the correct date/s. It is particularly critical when it comes to renting facilities. I need to get in there and rent them while they are still available. If toilets are required, I need locations to place them.
- 9. Volunteer Coupons; Andrea Berger assigns coupon codes for Meet Directors to use. Meet director coupons are good for free meets for a year. I assign meet worker volunteer coupons. Coupons are assigned to one coupon code, which means if you volunteer 3 times the coupon is worth 3 uses. Each time you volunteer the coupon will increment higher. Right now we have 171 consolidated & meet director coupons.

What worked well

- The park didn't have a group shelter so we rented a large tent to provide shelter. This worked well once we figured out we needed to keep gas in the generators.
- The park planted trees and shrubbery in our planned finish line plus it had rained the night before making the area unsafe. Course setter moved the finish shoot slightly which worked well.
- The Day area was perfect for the event, with more than adequate parking for cars and school busses, plenty of shelters for finish and food, and large play area for the kids.
- The Park staff was excellent. They helped crew set water on the course and were also helpful throughout the meet.

What didn't worked so well

Assigning start times is a very long process and stressful process, which is complicated when we
host SEIS or IS Champs as competitors, when we extend late reg, and when there is no Internet
access at the park. It was all hands on deck, so we got it done, but meet crew should spend
some time reviewing and addressing the issues before the next meet.



Epunch Highlights of 2015 - 2016

Purchases

- Second 32" LED Monitor for results display space (National meets)- completed
- 3 additional radio systems (short range wireless controls used with regular O-Lynx radios) initiated
 - eliminates extra radio with close controls (e.g. local meets with close START & FINISH, multiple START and/or FINISH controls) or hidden controls (e.g. control in ditch or behind boulder at base of cliff)
- replacement electronic controls for 2 lost and 2 that appear unrepairable initiated
- Bluetooth battery operated receipt printer (reduce dependency on generator for quick setup with minimal equipment; GOAT need) completed

G.O.A.T. (Georgia Advanced Orienteering Training)

- 6 day summer orienteering camp with Henry County HS JROTC
- modeled after TJOC with ~60 attendees
- 13 epunch events in 6 days (5 km run timing/Sprints/O-relays/classic orienteering/training courses)
- planning underway for 3rd GOAT (June 12-17, 2016)
